

## Preparing for Your Wedding

### **The Wedding Worksheet**

This worksheet helps us with the basic overall information for the big day and after! It is included in your packet and can also be downloaded from our website.

### **The Portrait Shotlist**

We ask you for a list of all POSED pictures you want taken at the wedding. Because we are photojournalists first and foremost, we try to do these pictures as quickly and efficiently as possible so we can get back to what we do best – capturing genuine moments of your celebration. We take only the shots requested on the list or by the bride or groom on the wedding day.

### **A Detailed Timeline**

This is a very helpful tool on the wedding day. Please list the times, locations and planned schedule for the entire day. Your photographer will review this with you beforehand.

### **One Photographer or Two?**

We are often asked what the advantages/differences are between one- and two-photographer packages. The differences will definitely come into play as you are planning. With two photographers, we usually send one with the bride and one with the groom for the preparation. This gives full and equal coverage to both sides of the wedding. These are some of our favorite moments! Both photographers can also do the bridesmaid and groomsmen group shots as soon as everyone is ready, which means fewer photos after the ceremony! Unless the bride and groom are getting ready at the same location, it is very difficult to have one photographer photograph both sides.

During the ceremony, two photographers can cover everything more thoroughly, allowing one to do wide-angled overall shots while the other concentrates on the emotional moments happening at the altar. They also cover different angles, so no matter if you turn, or if Uncle John steps in the path of the shot, we will not miss the moments!
